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MURÉ, Rouffach

Proud owners of the Clos St-Landelin and producers of one of the finest Sylvaners. I have included notes on wines other than Rieslings I happen to have tasted recently. Véronique Muré told me that, with south-facing vineyards and the effects of climate change, they are tending to pick earlier and earlier.

Lovely true rose-petal varietal aromas and rich honeyed quality with sufficient acidity (just) and not a hint of the bitterness or oiliness that can plague this variety. Medium dry and I would guess a versatile food partner. Quite nervy finish. Nicely. Some delicacy.

This producer is making purer and purer wines. This one is still very youthful with crystalline acidity in evidence but there is enough fruit to convince me all will come very well eventually. Very pure and well etched. (...) very promising.

Richer, thicker and more winning than the 2010. Almost heavy and oily but easier to love (with less obvious acidity) than the 2010. Floral, citrus, lilies, and a small impression of residual sugar. Very solid and rich. Good, substantial. Very long.

Particularly pale ruby. Subtle, violet-scented true Pinot. Correct with a spine. Delicate but with a very firm spine. Bone dry. Silky texture. Intense.
