84 MURÉ Riesling Alsace Grand Cru Clos Saint Landelin 2010

«An appealing toasty nose leads into a green apple and nectarine palate. Some residual sugar (RS) contributes to a great, full mouthfeel. Finished off with a big hit of citrus acidity.» Clinton Cawood (Imbibe Magazine).
